

EDITORIAL LETTER

Dear Stakeholders, Innovators, and Partners,

As we step into August, we reflect on a transformative July at the National ICT Innovation Hub, one marked by meaningful engagements, collaborative energy, and progress on multiple fronts in our mission to accelerate Uganda's digital transformation.

A major milestone was the hosting of the 2nd National ICT Summit at our Nakawa Hub, which convened over 500 stakeholders to explore how innovation can drive sustainable growth. With lively discussions on emerging technologies and sectoral transformation, the Summit affirmed our national commitment to turning policy into action.

We also launched the Entrepreneurial and Digital Skills Empowerment for Young Women program in partnership with Makerere University Business School, providing 250 young women from five public universities with hands-on skills in digital communication, data analytics, cybersecurity, and innovation.

As part of our continued support for startups at the Hub, we conducted a midterm review with founders to assess progress, identify growth bottlenecks, and align on strategies for scaling their innovations. These feedback sessions were a powerful reminder of the resilience, creativity, and potential within Uganda's startup ecosystem.

In addition, we hosted a professional talk focused on market sizing, helping innovators understand how to define and quantify their opportunity spaces. And through our collaboration with MTN ACE, we expanded digital skilling activities to Entebbe Municipality Division A, empowering youth with the foundational skills needed to thrive in today's economy.

As we carry this momentum into the months ahead, we remain focused on turning ideas into solutions, partnerships into impact, and innovation into opportunity, for every Ugandan, everywhere.

Establishing and managing an online presence




MIDTERM REVIEW OF THE NATIONAL ICT INNOVATION HUB'S FOUNDERS

LAUNCH OF THE EDEW PROGRAM: EMPOWERING YOUNG WOMEN IN THE DIGITAL ECONOMY

July 27th, 2025

The Permanent Secretary recently inaugurated the Entrepreneurial and Digital Skills for Employability of Women (EDEW) program at the National ICT Innovation Hub.

The primary objective of this initiative is to address the gender digital divide and enhance inclusive participation in Uganda's innovation and digital economy.

The program will equip 250 young women from five public universities with essential entrepreneurial and digital skills, focusing on areas such as developing an entrepreneurial mindset, digital communication, data analytics, cybersecurity, and digital innovation.

INNOVATION IN DATA PROTECTION AND PRIVACY

The National ICT Innovation Hub convened a significant dialogue on data protection and privacy, underscoring the necessity of balancing innovation with regulatory compliance.

Startup founders, government officials, and people from the Personal Data Protection Office worked together to find practical ways for startups to follow data protection rules, helping to close the gap between knowing about these rules and actually using them.

UJ-CONNECT PROJECT UPDATE ON UGANDA'S ICT SECTOR

30th July 2025

The Ministry of ICT and National Guidance and the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) held the fifth Joint Coordination Committee (JCC) meeting for the UJ-Connect Project at the National ICT Innovation Hub in Nakawa, focusing on the project's progress.

Key Achievements:

- *ICT Skillset Standard Booklet: Developed to define essential ICT competencies.*
- *Intellectual Property Guidelines: Workshops held to promote awareness and protection of local innovations.*
- *Capacity Building: Training sessions conducted in key ICT areas.*
- *Business Matching: Facilitated collaborations between Ugandan ICT companies and Japanese firms.*
- *Mentorship Programme: Supported start-ups and students with learning opportunities and exposure at international events.*



The project will ensure the sustainability of its outputs and plans a study tour to Japan in August 2025 to strengthen cooperation.



The UJ-Connect Project (2023-2027) aims to professionalise Uganda's ICT workforce and foster international partnerships.



MOMENTUM BUILDS FOR MTN ACE PHASE 2 INNOVATION HUBS IN EAST-ERN AND NORTHERN UGANDA

The MTN Ace Phase 2 initiative is advancing toward the establishment of Innovation Hubs in Eastern and Northern Uganda, following successful visits to Soroti, Busitema, and Gulu Universities.



At Soroti University, leaders emphasised the need for improved connectivity and resources for success.

Busitema University confirmed space for 45 computers and identified necessary upgrades, including air conditioning and internet access. Gulu University also expressed strong commitment to fostering innovation among youth.

The efforts highlight the importance of partnerships in creating innovation hubs that promote entrepreneurship and job opportunities across Uganda.



TOT ROBOTICS WORKSHOP EMPOWERS FUTURE MENTORS AHEAD OF WRO UGANDA

Nakawa, Uganda - July 11, 2025

The TOT Robotics Workshop, hosted by Mindset Coders and the Edutech Club in collaboration with the National ICT Innovation Hub, brought together 79 eager students from 20 institutions. Supported by Google and Camden Education Trust, the workshop focused on equipping participants with essential robotics and coding skills.

- Participants engaged in hands-on training with Arduino, enhancing their understanding of software-hardware interfaces. The diverse representation from institutions like Bishop Stuart University, Makerere University, and Uganda Christian University fostered collaboration and innovation.
- The workshop aimed to prepare students as mentors for younger learners, promoting STEM education within their communities and facilitating long-term transformation through digital skills.
- As participants prepare for the WRO Uganda National Championship on August 8, 2025, the workshop ignited a passion for innovation, positioning these students as future leaders and mentors in technology.
